


### Global Sustainable Development





SCOPING THE PARTNERSHIP Explore the idea of working together, examine how interests might align, explore and identify risks and benefits of partnering. agree on overall vision, goals and principles, determine roles for each partner, and draft up a partnering agreement. BUILDING THE PARTNERSHIP Decide on how the partnership will be governed; how partners. will communicate, both internally and to the public identify options for financing; scope out the need for human resources; develop a monitoring and evaluation programme, and identify stakeholders and beneficiaries. IMPLEMENTING AND MAINTAINING THE PARTNERSHIP Partners start delivering on their commitments, while jointly communicating and monitoring the process. External communication will also commence. REVIEWING THE PROGRESS Basedontheestablished monitoring and review process, partners will take stock of their progress towards their agreed-upon goals. They will also assess the impact of the partnership on its beneficiaries. Regular monitoring and review throughout the partnership will allow the partners to learn from their experiences and adapt as needed. PARTNERSHIP END If the timeline for the partnership has come to an end, the partners will need to evaluate whether to close the partnership, continue in its current. format, change the format to something different, or expand or scale up. the partnership. This is a time of reflection for the partnership, where lassons learned should be recorded, and a final evaluation undertaken.

### Main objectives of the SDG PP



- Joint advocacy and policy dialogue to create an enabling environment that helps partnerships grow and thrive.
- Identify and broker large transformative scale PPPs that are SDG aligned under Vision 2030, MTPIII and UNDAF in Kenya to drive shared value creation.
- Raise required investments for the PPPs under 2 above, through optimizing a diversity of blended financing instruments and redirection of capital flows towards SDG implementation, engaging a wide range of stakeholders from public and private sector.
- Facilitate monitoring and evaluation, learning and research to inform best and promising policy and practice for SDG partnerships and impact measurement.
